

ISSUES IN CULTURE

Scripture is consistently clear:

God forbids homosexual activity.

God forbids every form of sexual activity outside of marriage between husband and wife.

<u>Matt. 5:28</u> "But I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

ISSUES IN CULTURE - HOMOSEXUALITY

<u>Titus 3:1-6</u>

Remind them to be subject to rulers and authorities, to obey, to be ready for every good work, ² to speak evil of no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing all humility to all men.³ For we ourselves were also once foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving various lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful and hating one another.

<u>Titus 3:1-2</u> Remind them to <u>be subject</u> to rulers and authorities, to <u>obey</u>, to be ready for every <u>good work</u>, ² to <u>speak evil of no one</u>, to be <u>peaceable</u>, <u>gentle</u>, showing all <u>humility</u> to all men.

- Be obedient
- Do good

- Be peaceable
- Be gentle
- Slander no one
 Be humble

Why? Because this is how Christ treated us when we were living in rebellion to Him.

Questions we should ask ourselves when responding to this issue

1. Am I focusing on less common sins while ignoring more popular categories of sin?

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- 1. Am I focusing on less common sins while ignoring more popular categories of sin?
- 2. Am I expecting people to obey Christ who aren't committed to following Him?
- 3. Am I responding to homosexual sin the same way I would respond to heterosexual sin?

How do we respond to those who have same sex attraction?

 Remember that same-sex attraction is different from same-sex actions.

 The church should be the safest place for a person who is experiencing SSA.

For the person with same sex attraction, No physical option feels hopeful.

- Choose celibacy—it feels unbearable (No pot of gold at end of rainbow)
- Choose heterosexual marriage—it feels risky.
- Choose homosexual life—it is unbiblical

How should I handle same sex attraction (or a friend)?

- Tell someone you trust to talk about it.
- Don't view your struggle with sin as different than other Christian's struggles.
- If you have a friend with SSA, the best thing you can do is open your home and life to them. Involve them in your life.

For every distortion you believe about God, there is a corresponding consequence.

For every distortion you believe about yourself there is also a corresponding consequence.

Objection: I was born gay. How can it be wrong?

 No scientific/genetic evidence exists proving a "gay gene" or that someone is born homosexual. Note: study on identical twins

Objection: I was born gay. How can it be wrong?

- No scientific/genetic evidence exists that a person is born homosexual.
- However everyone is "born this way" with brokenness and sin and has propensities to certain sins.

So if people aren't born homosexual, why is it that some people feel this way?

- The Father's Role
- Developmental Factors
- Environmental Factors

Presuppositions of the Homosexual Community

- I was born Gay. Therefore . . .
 - Homosexuality is my identity.
 - Everything about homosexuality is normal and natural.
 - No other view of sexuality more valid than my alternative way to live.
 - My sexual orientation is a civil rights issue, not a moral issue.

Presuppositions of Historic Christianity

- God created sex to be a sacred expression of love within marriage of one man and one woman.
- All sex outside of that marriage is prohibited and morally wrong.
- A homosexual is not born that way. The thinking and behavior is learned, developed, or chosen. Homosexuality is not something that you are, (identity); it is something that you do.

Presuppositions of Historic Christianity

- Scripture doesn't teach that people are guilty for having same-sex attraction, only practicing homosexuality.
- Rather than being an acceptable "alternative" way of living, it is actually a destructive lifestyle to those who practice it.
- Homosexual behavior is a moral issue which something wrong is being promoted as something right.
