GETTING TO KNOW YOU

- 1 Can you name a movie, book, or T.V. show that had lying as its central theme?
- 2 In your opinion, how truthful do you think we are as a culture? What evidence do you see to support this trend?

TITUS: DIGGING DEEPER

- 1 This week, Kyle looked at Titus 1:9-16 which highlights the reason why qualified elders are so important . . . because false teachers are a real danger to the church. Read through this passage in your group and highlight anything that stands out to you that you would like to discuss or know more about.

Titus 1:9-16 ⁹ holding to the faithful message as taught, so that he will be able both to encourage with sound teaching and to refute those who contradict it. ¹⁰ For there are many who are insubordinate, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision party. ¹¹ They must be silenced, since they are upsetting whole families by teaching for shameful gain what they ought not to teach.

¹² One of the Cretans, a prophet of their own, said, "Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons."

¹³ This testimony is true. Therefore rebuke them sharply, that they may be sound in the faith, ¹⁴ not devoting themselves to Jewish myths and the commands of people who turn away from the truth. ¹⁵ To the pure, all things are pure, but to the defiled and unbelieving, nothing is pure; but both their minds and their consciences are defiled. ¹⁶ They profess to know God, but they deny him by their works. They are detestable, disobedient, unfit for any good work.
