



Philippians 4:10-13 I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at length you have revived your concern for me. You were indeed concerned for me, but you had no opportunity.

<sup>11</sup> Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content.

Contentment is not dependent on our circumstances

Content: self sufficient, independent of circumstances, satisfied

Philippians 4:10-13 ESV

Three Sinful Attitudes that lead to discontentment:

- 1. Ingratitude
- 2. Arrogance
- 3. Lust/Greed

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 Rejoice always,

17 pray without ceasing, 18 in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

- <sup>12</sup> I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need.
- 1. Prosperity doesn't have the power to give us contentment, nor poverty the power to take it away.
- 2. Contentment is learned, so we need to become teachable.

Acts 9:15-16 But the Lord said to him, "Go, for he is a chosen vessel of Mine to bear My name before Gentiles, kings, and the children of Israel.

16 "For I will show him how many things he must suffer for My name's sake."

Six times Paul gives us catalogues of his afflictions (Rom 8:35, 1 Cor 4:9-13, 2 Cor 4:8-9, 6:4-5, 11:23-39, 12:10)

2 Corinthians 11:25-29 <sup>5</sup> Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea;

<sup>26</sup> on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers;

Philippians 4:10-13 ESV

<sup>27</sup> in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure. 28 And, apart from other things, there is the daily pressure on me of my anxiety for all the churches. 29 Who is weak, and I am not weak?

#### For the Christian;

- 1. Their bad things will work out for good. Romans 8:28
- 2. Their good things cannot be taken away. Romans 8:1
- 3. Their best things are yet to come.

<sup>13</sup> I can do all things through him who strengthens me.
