The Way of Kings April 10, 2022 Small Group Discussion Questions

- 1) Share with your group when the last time was that you read through the Kings and Chronicles and tell one or two things you remember from when you read those scriptures.
- Joe discussed these following lessons which we could observe. Which of these resonate with you and why:
 - a) From Hezekiah A child can choose to follow the Lord even when coming from a father who is a poor example. Mothers and grandmothers can choose to greatly influence their children to trust God. (Lois and Eunice 2 Tim 1:5)
 - b) From Manasseh A child can choose not to follow the Lord even when coming from a father who is a good example. A leader must choose to live a godly life or risk being responsible for taking his followers astray ("...they did what was evil..."). God's patience eventually runs out.
 - c) From Amon A child might choose to follow your example. Choose to lead wisely. Amon's father Manasseh did not.
 - d) From Josiah Even with an ungodly father and an ungodly grandfather, children are to reject non-biblical values and choose to follow God wholeheartedly.
- 3) On 3/20, Kyle challenged us. He asked, "What will I be doing for the body of Jesus Christ that will last for eternity?" Joe followed up with three simple questions that every believer should be able to share with their small group. So, to net it out, can you please share with your group when you trusted Jesus for salvation, where you were baptized, and what ministry you do at Grace Point Church.
- 4) At the men's breakfast, Rick Jenks encouraged us to make sure we were enjoying "true fellowship". What one thing would you like to change about your small group to enable better true fellowship?
- 5) Hezekiah did right before the Lord. When we want to do what is right in the Lord's sight, what resources do we have that Hezekiah did not?
- 6) Though it is God's ideal plan for children to have godly parental examples, how can He use negative experiences in our lives to enable us to minister to others in a special way?
