## The Velcro Principle

#### **Key Scriptures**

Phil. 2:13 for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

Prov. 13:20 He who walks with wise men will be wise, But the companion of fools will be destroyed.

Heb. 10:24-25 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, <sup>25</sup> not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another-- and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Matt. 28:18-20 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

2 Tim. 2:2 and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also.

**Key Point:** Being in community is a spiritual discipline.

# TALK IT OVER

**Start talking**: Pick a conversation starter for your group.

 Since this is the beginning of a new group semester, take some time to break the ice by playing two truths and a lie (every person says two things true about themselves and one thing that isn't, and the rest of the group guesses the one that isn't).

#### **Start thinking**. Ask questions to get your group thinking.

- Based on Sunday's message, how would you describe the mission of Grace Point Church?
- What do both Matt 28:18-20 and 2 Tim 2:2 have in common? In what ways are they saying different things?
- What is Phil 2:13 telling us about ourselves, and about God?
- What are the reasons behind meeting together in Heb 10:24-25?

#### **Start sharing**. Choose a question to create openness.

- In reference to Prov. 13:20, can you share an experience where peer pressure or influence had a positive impact on your spiritual journey? How did it happen?
- In what ways can being part of a connect group enhance our understanding of the Bible and help us grow in our faith? What were the ways Kyle mentioned that Groups
- What are some things that you would like to see happen this next semester in your connect group?

### **Start doing.** Commit to a step and live it out this week!

• If you are reading these questions, odds are you are in a Connect Group already. That's great news! How can you contribute to group life this semester? (volunteer for bringing stacks; volunteer to host; plan on some part of a meal/get together, or something to do with the Christmas Party/Fellowship etc.) Think about ways you would like to contribute, and discuss them with the rest of the group by next week's meeting.
